


of the status of women in their respective provinces. The following year, such an advisory council was established in Saskatchewan and, in Ontario, the provincial government instituted a Women's Crown Employees Office to promote the status of female provincial civil servants.

Apart from organizations such as these specifically designed to help improve the status of women at both the federal and provincial levels, many jurisdictions have established a human rights commission that is responsible, among its other duties, for promoting the principle of equal opportunities for all, including women.
