The Bill No. 81 (Letter C2 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to amend the Winding-up Act, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, and progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again, this day.

The House resolved itself again into Committee of Supply.
