**Hon. G. J. McIlraith (Solicitor General):** Mr. Speaker, the answer to part 1 of this question is yes; Mr. Henry Moos, Kennedy Travel Bureau, 296 Queen Street West, Toronto, Ontario. The answer to part 2 is that Mr. Moos was charged that he did sign a declaration without the due administration of the declaration, contrary to section 12 of the Commissioners For Taking Affidavits Act, R.S.O. 1950, chapter 57. The answer to part 3 is that the information was laid before Mr. B. Jeffery, J.P., Toronto, Ontario on October 4, 1968. The summons served on Mr. Moos is returnable at magistrate's court, Toronto on November 13, 1968.
