Mr. Bertrand (Laurier), a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,— Return to an Order of the House of March 14, 1949, for a Return showing:— 1. What is the over-all floor space of the Post Office at Churchill, Manitoba?

4. Is mail stored at this post office over periods of time awaiting navigation?

5. Are postal boxes available for rental?

6. By what percentage has the receipt of mail increased at this point in the last 3 years?

7. For how many outposts is mail stored for periods of time at this post office?

8. Has the Postmaster General received resolutions from Churchill asking for increased facilities? If so, what action has been taken upon such requests?
