Bill S-4, An Act to amend the Customs Act.—Mr. Basford.

Bill S-13, An Act respecting the Boundary between the Provinces of Alberta and British Columbia.—Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale).

Mr. Trudeau, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of Telex to Provincial Premiers, dated October 16, 1974, concerning the 15th Annual Premiers' Conference. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 301-5/19.

Mr. Andras (Port Arthur), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Pamphlet entitled "What you need to know about Employing Foreign Workers". (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 301-7/3.

Mr. Whelan, seconded by Mr. Lang, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-34, An Act to amend the Farm V 24—1

Credit Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Farm Credit Act to increase the capital of the Corporation from sixty-six to one hundred million dollars; to extend the application of the Act by providing under the circumstances prescribed, for loans to establish young farmers as defined by the Act; to provide in the manner prescribed, that loans may be made to young farmers in an amount greater than ninety per cent of appraised value of lands and chattels as determined by regulation; to provide that the total outstanding amount of a loan in respect of a single farming enterprise of a young farmer shall not exceed \$150,000; and to provide for consequential amendments to the Act.
