Memorandum from John Nelson, Honorary Secretary of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, the members of the Executive Council. The following resolutions will be submitted at the next meeting of the Executive Council of the Canadian Institute of International Affaire, to be held early in the month of Jenuary, 1931: To smend Article 4 of the Constitution of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, to read as follows: There may also be such Honorary Presidents and Monorary Vice-Presidents as the Council may plect." To smend Article 7 of the Constitution to read as follows: "The members of a branch may elect associate members who are students at any University or Phodes Scholars or persons in similar categories and who are British subjects. Such associate members shall not be required to pay the munual membership fee hereinbefore mentioned, but such lesser annual fee as the members of the branch may prescribe. The associate members shall not be entitled to the publications of the Royal Institute, of the Institute of Pacific Relations, or of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, end shall not be entitled to the privileges usually accorded to members of the branch by these Institutes, but only to such privileges as may be specially accorded them by these Institutes." To add to Article 8 of the Constitution: "The Executive Council may appoint a research committee and the chairman thereof and such chairman shall be, ex officio, a member of the Executive Council." To smend Article 3, of the Constitution for Local Branches to read as follows: The foregoing provision with regard to membership fee shall not apply to associate members who may be elected under Article 7 of the Constitution of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs. Associate mombers shall pay such fee as may be prescribed by this branch." Montreal, Que. December 6th, 1930.
