nal is BELIAR, which word requires no explanation, and I am so that the translators did not print the name just as it stands in the greek testament. BELIAR, is the title that Paul gave to the devil, and he was repeating just what the Saviour said of him, "He was a Murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a LIAR and the father of it.
