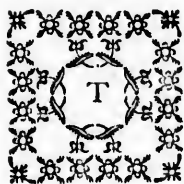

THE campaign of the year 1756 in A. D. 1756. North America was closed with as little honour to those employed in its operations, and with less advantage to the nation, than that of the year 1755, though at a greater national expence, and with much larger supplies of men and officers from Old England. Which occasioned a serious observer of those times to remark, That the situation of affairs in North America grew more and more dangerous; and that it seemed to him, that the more the colonies were strengthened from Great Britain, the more ground they lost against the French, whose number of regular troops, this year, were much inferior to ours ^a.
