qui, and where the River Outawawa, falls into it near Mont-Real was formerly called

the River Iroquois.

That the *Iroquois* have conquered most of the other Tribes inhabiting between them and the River *Missippi*; and therefore those Lands by right of Conquest belong to the *Iroquois*, and as such are considered by them.

That by the Treaty of Utrecht the Iroquois and their Country are expresly acknowledged to belong to, and be under the Dominion of, the Crown of Great-Britain.

That in 1744, at a Conference between the Commissioners of the Colony of Virginia, and the Deputies of the Six Nations at Lancaster in Pennsylvania, the Deputies of the Six Nations expressly afferted their right to the Soil of the Country claimed by the Colony of Virginia from the Mountains backwards; and for a valuable Consideration at that Time sold it to that Colony.

That the Colonies of the Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Virginia claim Extent as farWest, as the SouthSea sounded originally on a Grant of King James 1st. in 1606.

Notwithstanding the notoriety of these Facts, and these express Stipulations, the French did, after the Treaty of Utrecht, make some Encroachments on the North
