If reproof be necessary, "deal prudently," but never shrink from it to any one.

Be faithful, pointed, plain, and affectionate. Shew that you have the good of the reproved at heart.

XIX.—OF PERSONAL DUTY. "Ye are not your own."

" Know thyself." Reverence thyself. " Deny thyself." Govern thyself.

"Abhor" and flee from "the appearance of evil." Guard the senses.

Avoid all occasions to impurity of heart. Eat and drink "to the glory of Goo." Eat to live, rather than live to eat. Be careful of health? Avoid repletion.

XX.—OF RELATIVE DUTY.

" Love thy neighbour as thyself." " Do unto all men as you would they should do unto you" were you in their circumstances.

As a sacred duty, visit the sick. Always pray with them. Read to them the Scriptures. Ascertain their state. Lead them to Christ.

Cultivate the disposition of compassion to the poor: care for their spiritual interests.

> XXI.—OF MAKING PROGRESS. " Go forward."

Religion is the greatest business of life; therefore begin the day with God in prayer
