Big Falling Off in Supply of Good Latie-Hogs Up 25 Cents

MONTREAL, Dec. 4.—At the Montreal Stock Yards west end market, the receipts of live stock for the week ending Dec. 2 were 15.0 cattle, 1:00 sneep and lambs, 1760 hogs and 250 calves. The offerings on the market this morning amounted to 175 cattle 1000 sheep and lambs, 600 hogs and 125 calves.

The tone of the market for good butchers' cattle was much stronger than a week ago, and prices show an advance of 10c to 25b per 100 pounds on account of the fact that the supply was much less than half, of which the pervantage of common and inferior grades was much smaller than it has been of late, which all tended to create a better feeling in the trade.
