OTTAWA, March 26 .- The government has closed the deal for most of the 2700 acres of land in March and Nepean Townships, about four miles from Britannia, which it is seeking. The land has, it is rumored, been se-cured for a new infantry summer camp rather than for rifle ranges.

Must Give Passes to Legislators. PROVIDENCE, R.I., March 26.—(Can. Press.)—A public utilities bill, the feature of which is a clause making it obligatory for all railroads in the state to furnish passes to state officers and members of the legislature, passed the house to-day by a viva voce vote, after a long debate. The bill provides for the creation of a public utilities com-mission of three, which is given liberal authority in regulating public service corporations.




