Making Graphite With Sawdust. An important electrical indus Niagara Falls manufactures graphite.
The raw materials used consist of anthractic coal, glass, sand, foundry coke and sawdust. The furnaces for the conversion of the anthracite coal or petroleum coke into graphite are in the form of long troughs built of fire brick. At the end of each trough is a terminal built of carbon rods, to which is connected the cable conveying the current. The sand, coke and sawdust are mixed in the proper proportions and the trough is filled with anthracite coal in which is embedded a carcite coal in which clearly connection bon rod to make electrical connection between the terminals, as the coal is a very poor conductor of electricity. The temperature to which the coal is raised before conversion into graphite is very high, and is said to approximate 7500 degrees Fahrenheit. When the furnace has cooled sufficiently the graphite is removed, but it is not yet the furnace has cooled sufficiently the graphite is removed, but it is not yet in commercial form and has to be ground to powder and finally separated into the sizes necessary for the various uses to which graphite is put.
