RAILROAD MEN AT CHURCH

Four Hundred Hear an Eloquent Sermon by Rev. C. O. Johnson

In the Bechtel-Avenue Methodist Church—All the Brotherhoods Represented—Characteristics of Railway Employees and How Their Unions Ought to Deal With the Companies—The Railway Men Express Their Appreciation of the Minister's Remarks.

Upwards of 400 railroad men paraded from the division houses yesterday afternoon to attend the special service conducted by Rev. C. O. Johnson in Bechtel-Avenue Methodist Church, under their auspices. There were present representatives from the Order of Railway Conductors, the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen, the Brotherhood of Railway Telegraphers and the Brotherhood of Trainmen.
