Barrie, Sept. 7.—(Special).—This afternoon D. B. Johnson, who was arrested in Toronto on Saturday, on a charge of violating the Charitable Act, was sent up for trial. Mrs. Harrington of Barrie, who is mother of the 15-year-old girl, Elva, whom the prisoner is charged with seducing, swore that "Prof." Johnson came to her place on Aug. 18, as an eye specialist. He asked to stay all night, and was permitted to do so after putting up his horse for the night. He remained the next day, during which he succeeded in gaining the confidence of his hostess and family. He urged the mother to allow her daughter to go to live with a doctor in Toronto, whom Johnson said he knew wished such a girl. He therefore went to Barrie on the Saturday following and returned, saying that he had telephoned to the city doctor, who agreed to give Elva \$12 per month. He asked that the girl be sent ready, promising to take her to Toronto, whereupon he would return to complete his business engagements. The mother had not the money to pay the girl's fare, so the professor gallantly offered to advance the money. On Sunday the professor and Elva started off in the buggy, to which was tied a bicycle, he having promised the mother that he would take as much care of the young and innocent girl as if he were her own father. They were to go via Hamilton (which Mrs. Harrington erroneously thought was on the railway), where he had a business engagement. There he was to see that the girl got proper lodgings over night, and from there go to Toronto by train in the morning. Elva swore that he took her to Hamilton, but on the way had shown his brutal and ungentlemanly conduct toward her. He kept her in Hamilton until Tuesday morning, then drove her across the country to Elmvale, where he sold her face to Barrie, while he remained behind. She told a harrowing tale of his treatment of her. He had along with him a revolver and an instrument resembling the description of a catheter. At Barrie she went to a friend's, to whom she told her troubles. Johnson, a man probably 25 or 30 years of age. He offered no defence.
