WHEAT NEWS STILL BEARISH

Wheat news was again bearish today. The market showed some steadiness at the close.

Spot wheat in Liverpool eased off and 14 to 24 day futures closed 1/32 to 1/16 lower than yesterday. Market advanced 1/16 to 20 centimes for the day, with four-up 30c to 50c.

Early Delivery Sells Below December Option

Chicago corn futures held steady on light receipts today. The leading states make local receipts in 24 the leading states make an average rate of yield for winter wheat of 14.9 bushels per acre, and spring 16.2 bushels, according to the monthly crop report of the American Agriculturist of Oct. 4. Applying these averages to the total acreage it appears the winter wheat crop reaches a total of 335,921,000 bushels, and spring wheat exports about \$2,850,000.

World's Visible

According to the latest available supply of wheat of the Rockies last week increased 2,905,000 bushels, and that in Europe and Africa 1,974,000 bushels, making a total increase of 7,185,000 bushels. Corn increased 586,000 bushels, and oats 290,000 bushels.

Another Crop Estimate

London, Oct. 4.—The wool auction sales were continued today. There was a good demand for all grades at Saturday prices. Merinos were quickly taken.
