BACON A PRISONER DESPITE PROMISE OF BEING IMMUNE

Was To Have Been Government Witness, But Spies Confessed.

NEW YORK, March 23.—George Vaux Bacon, recently returned from England after he had been given a King's pardon on his promise to testify here against Albert O. Sander and Charles N. Wunnenberg, German spies, was lodged in the Tombs prison today. He will appear Monday before a federal judge to plead to an indictment charged to have a strike.
Sander and Wunnenberg pleaded guilty to the charge against them, and were sentenced to two years each in the federal penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga. Bacon, who had been arrested in England as a spy, was to have been the chief witness against them.
Since his return here Bacon has been guarded closely by agents of the department of justice. He was unprepared, it was said, to tell of his employment by Sander and Wunnenberg to go to England and obtain information of the location of their anti-aircraft bases, and the terminals of their cables. It was thought Bacon would probably be given immunity, inasmuch as he had consented to become a government witness, and had been prevented from doing so only by Sander and Wunnenberg pleading guilty, thus making a trial unnecessary.

DETECTIVE SWEARS VON KLEIST TOLD OF FIRING 2 SHIPS

Mentions the Inchmooir and the Tynghame.

NEW YORK, March 23.—Further testimony regarding the alleged conspiracies by Germans to destroy Entente vessels leaving New York harbor with munitions, was introduced today by the Government in the trial of Captain Charles von Kleist, a chemist, and four engineers of the German merchantman Friedrich de Grosse, now tied up at Hoboken. The men are charged with having placed bombs on ships.
Henry Barth, a bomb squad detective, gave the names of two British freighters, Tynghame and Inchmooir, which he swore, von Kleist mentioned as vessels on which the alleged plotters placed bombs. The Inchmooir was found afire at her pier in December, 1915, and \$100,000 damage was done to her cargo. Two fires in December within a week, one at her pier and the other at sea, did \$200,000 damage to the Tynghame.
George D. Barnitz, also a bomb squad detective, testified that von Kleist made a statement setting forth that some of the defendants placed bombs on ships in the harbor, usually six or eight to the vessel, with explosives sometimes in sugar barges.
Cross examination did not alter the stories of Barth and Barnitz. The case was adjourned until Monday.

HOLLAND REJECTS NEIGHBORLY OFFER OF GERMAN GOVT.

Proposal to Rent Ships to Dutch on "Reasonable Conditions."

THE HAGUE, via London, March 23. The Dutch foreign office in a statement in reference to the seven Dutch steamships torpedoed off Plymouth recently says that the German Government on March 6 offered to pay an indemnity for the loss of members of the crews and to help the owners by facilitating the purchase of German ships after the war. This offer, the statement adds, was made "on considerations of humanity and good neighborliness." Further steps led to a reconsideration of the offer by Germany, which now offers German ships for rental "on reasonable conditions."
Holland, it is declared, rejected the offer, and the owners, under the circumstances, also refused to accept the proposal of indemnification for the crews.

\$1,800,000 PLAN FOR WATERWORKS MEETS COMMISSION'S IDEA

Ambitious Union Scheme Is Approved by Border Municipalities.

WINDSOR, March 23.—Far-reaching recommendations were made by Morris Knowles, consulting engineer of Essex, border utilities commission, in making his final report on water supply and sewage treatment for six participating municipalities today.
The engineer reported in favor of an ultimate water supply, with intake at the lower end of Pelee Island, and with a pumping station and purification plant adjacent, and a trunk line with takeoffs at various points. The estimated cost is \$1,800,000, and the annual charges \$200,180.
For immediate improvement, he suggests that the commission arrange to take over the Windsor waterworks, and operate the pumping station for Windsor, Sandwich West, and Odessa. The cost, including an allowance to Windsor, would be \$278,000, with annual charges of \$41,140.
In dealing with the sewer problem, Mr. Knowles recommends that Ford City proceed to construct a sewer system as designed by Mr. Murray of Toronto. It is proposed to have sewerage from Ford City delivered to a pumping station near the west main sewer in Walkerville, lifted to an in-plant, and thence to the river. The commission after sitting the entire day finally decided to accept the recommendations as outlined in the engineer's report.

Grandmother of Revolution Freed After 43 Years

LONDON, March 24.—A dispatch to Reuters' Telegraph Company from Petrograd, dated Wednesday, states that Mrs. Katherine Breshkovskaya, "grandmother of the Russian revolution," would arrive in Petrograd Friday night after having been 43 years in prison or exile. She was sentenced to penal servitude in 1874, but was released early in the 90's. Later she was banished to Siberia for belonging to the Socialist revolutionary party.

BREWERY TAX HOLDS UP WATERLOO ESTIMATES

Provincial Exemption May Mean Mill and Half Increase.

WATERLOO, March 23.—The finance committee of the town council met tonight for the purpose of dealing with estimates for year. It was impossible, however, to decide the tax rate as it is not yet known if the Ontario Legislature purposes exempting from business tax breweries and hotels this year. If it does it will mean a mill and a half of taxation which will have to be made up by an increase in the ordinary tax rate.
