#### LONDON HAS 40,000 TONS OF ANTHRACITE PACKED IN ITS BINS

Forty Per Cent of Allotment For Year.

DEALERS KEEPING CHECK

Declare That Only 70 Per Cent of Supply Is Being Delivered.

London's coal allotment for this winter is 100,065 tons, and 40 per cent of this amount has been received in the city up to September 18. On the basis that there are 13,000 homes in the city, this would mean that there are three tons for every home here.
