### NEWMARKET MAN RAN AUTO IN DITCH TO SAVE BOY

Farm Near Amber Brings Good Price—News Notes From All Over the Big County.

**AMBER, Aug. 7.**—(Special.)—The sale of one of the best wheat farms in this district, the property of Albert Cross, lot 8, rear concession 4, Markham Township, was reported. The purchaser is Mr. Hurd of concession 4, York Township. The farm is situated on the line of the Canadian National railway, and is a very desirable location for a home and a place of business.
