

Arrangements Completed OUTFIT FOR FREE SENIORS

of Six Star-Play- ers Coming

St. Catharines, Ont., Oct. 27.—(By Canadian Press).—David McNeal, acquitted last Friday night at the Welland assizes of the murder of Margaret Boucek at Thorold on July 1 last, is still in Welland jail, awaiting deportation in the hands of American federal officers, who will take him to Philadelphia to answer to charges of robbery and shooting a policeman.

Several citizens of Welland have interested themselves in McNeal's behalf in an effort to prevent his deportation. McNeal is willing to be extradited and go to Philadelphia to answer the charges rather than be deported, which procedure would close the door against his return to Canada, a country that he vociferously enlisted to fight for, although he never reached France.

Several religious organizations have taken up the case and have applied to the G.W.V.A. for assistance in making representations before the minister of justice.
