OXFORD HONORS FOR CANADIANS

How Rhodes Scholars Fared Last Year—Election in Canada in 1929.

London, Jan. 4.—The report of the Rhodes Trustees for 1927-8 states that the number of scholars in residence at Oxford during the year was 139, derived as follows:

Oversea States and Colonies 69 United States and Canada 70

The whole number in residence for 1928-9 is 178, who are distributed thus:

There are, in addition, eleven ex-scholars in residence for the October term, engaged either in teaching, research work, or special study. The total of 189 thus reached is the highest yet attained.

Among the Oxford honors gained by scholars or ex-scholars during the year were: G. J. Archibald, of Quebec, and New College—A fellowship of All Souls.

E. R. Lloyd, of West Virginia and Wadham—A Burdett-Goutts scholarship, worth £100 a year for two years.

C. F. Tucker Brooke, of West Virginia and St. John's—A Senior Demingship at Magdalen.

Chester B. Martin, of New Brunswick and Balliol—A Beit prize in colonial history, worth £20, and Beaumont scholarship in colonial history, worth £100.

H. J. Ross, of Quebec and Balliol—A Beaumont scholarship, worth £100 a year for two years.

T. Dunstun, of Tasmania and Corpus—A University geographical scholarship, worth £200.

The examination results for the year show the following awards: B. Litt. Degree, 3; B.Sc. Degree, 3; B. C. L. Degree, 2. Final Honors Schools—First Class, 4; Second Class, 19; Third Class, 15; Fourth Class, 3. Two diplomas were obtained in HONORABLE MENTION in Chemistry.

In athletics it is mentioned that four scholars (all South Africans) played in the rugby team against Cambridge, and one of the team, a Scotchman, in international rugby matches. In sports five scholars (three Americans and two Canadians) were members of the Canadian team in cricket, in cricket one (colonial) in lacrosse seven (five colonial and two American), in lawn tennis two (colonial), and in water sports one (colonial) represented Oxford against Cambridge.

There will be an election of scholars for 1929 in Canada, Australia, South Africa, New Zealand, Newfoundland, Jamaica and Bermuda, and five German scholars will be nominated by the German Government.
