VICE-REGAL VISITORS LEFT FOR ST. ANDREW'S LAST NIGHT

The visit of their Excellencies the Governor General and Countess Grey to St. John, was brought to a close last evening and terminated in what may fittingly be called a blaze of glory, with a magnificent fireworks display in Rockwood Park, which was witnessed, it is estimated, by between 20,000 and 30,000 people--the largest crowd ever gathered together in one place in this city.


PEOPLE OF NOTE


