Women Police In Great Britain

London, Feb. 4.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press).—"I think we have won a permanent place for the woman policeman in England," said Miss A. Danner Dawson, commandant of the women's police service, in response to an inquiry as to the present status of the organization. "We have at least proved our usefulness, although we have not accomplished as much as we would have done if we had been given a better chance or a wider opportunity. But we must not complain. We are young as an organization. We are growing steadily in power and influence. That is something."

The women police service was founded at the beginning of the war for the purpose of training a body of women who might be used as "substitute police," more especially as protective and preventive agents among women and children.

Used in Small Cities

Some eight or nine cities have placed trained police women as regular parts of their forces. Perhaps the biggest opening for their activity, in view of the present national emergency, has been found in the munition factories. Here, many hundreds are required. The police woman in the munition factory is part detective, part chaplain, part welfare worker, part constable or watchman.

The course of training which would be police women undergo under Miss Dawson's supervision is a stiff one. There is attendance at police courts to learn the methods of procedure and instruction on special duties and on various aspects of the law relating to women and children. There is a first aid course, with stretchers and fire drill, and there is also a "laboratory" course of practical patrol work on the London streets to teach the recruit how to handle the every-day tasks with tact, firmness and helpfulness.

Factory Duties

"The policeman's work in the factories means an interesting and busy life," said Miss Dawson. "They are responsible for the keeping of the gates, examining workers' passes, stopping and escorting of strangers and visitors. There are generally two gates to a big munitions plant, one controlled by men police, the other by women police. Male workers and the usually male police are the gate guards by male police, while women and girls use the other. In some factories, the women police do most of the work of patrolling the factory area. They protect the younger workers from the rougher elements and they travel on work trains to prevent rowdiness."

At most of the factories the police women are sworn in and have the full powers of an ordinary constable.

MECCA TO BE CENTRE OF MOHAMMEDANISM

New York, Feb. 22.—"If Turkey and the Central Powers with whom she is allied suffer a decisive defeat in the present war," said the Rev. Wm. L. Sullivan, of All Souls' Unitarian church, at a meeting of the People's Institute in Cooper Union, "it seems probable that Arabia, with the assistance of England, will rise to prominence among the nations of the world and that Mecca, instead of Constantinople, will be the centre of Mohammedanism."

Dr. Sullivan said he saw a great and important change in the religion of Islam growing out of its relation with the present war.

"For the first time since Mohammed lived," he said, "Mohammedans have refused to answer a call to a Holy War. This refusal shows the disfavor into which the religion has fallen."

Bethlehem Steel Co. to Spend \$5,000,000 for New Equipment

New York, Feb. 22.—The Bethlehem Steel Company has well under way the building for the manufacture of sixteen inch guns for the United States navy and the army coast defenses. The total outlay will be in the neighborhood of \$5,000,000 before the task of actually making the great guns begins.

The company has numerous new problems to solve in this work, as guns as large as these have never been built before in this country. The lugs from which the gun "tubes," or "jackets" will be rolled and machined will weigh close to 50 tons each.

"The manufacture of these ingots," says The Iron Age, "requires especially large molds and heating facilities. To take care of the physical properties of the steel, an annealing and heat-treating department, equipped with annealing and heat-treating furnaces varying in size from twenty-four feet to ninety feet in length and eight feet in width, is about to be installed. The building housing this equipment is approximately ninety feet by 400 feet, abutting a building 115 feet wide by 240 feet in length, housing the furnace proper."

The assembling of these huge guns represents an unusual proposition, requiring a crane of 175 tons capacity to lift the combined weight of a gun. The fuel gas for the furnaces is brought from the Lehigh Coke Company's plant through a forty-two-inch main which has just been completed. The main is 11,900 feet in length. For machining and
