Statement Through a Friend Says She Has Been Misrepresented. (New York Times.) Arthur S. Friend, of 485 Fifth avenue, a friend of Geraldine Farrar, singer, said last night that Mrs. Farrar was eager to dispel the misapprehension concerning her position and views toward Geraldine. "Mrs. Farrar," said Mr. Friend, "wishes that she is an American through and through, that her sympathies are American, and her artistic and personal hopes are based on a sense of deep obligation to the native American land and its people." Mrs. Farrar, said Mr. Friend, denied having written a letter, published in London as from her, containing the sentence, "I am a Germanophile through and through. I am much too loyal to Germany to assume the American people to or oblige them." He also asserted that the singer had been grossly misrepresented. She was born in Melrose, Mass.
