Need For Development of British Industry Discussed in London

LONDON, Nov. 13—How to get more British on movie screens through-out the British Empire is one of the problems now engaging the Imperial Conference. The sub-committee dealing with the subject was to complete its work yesterday, but struck a snag and had to adjourn without decision. It will continue its efforts to reach an agreement Monday. mitted a film production program and numerous projects were presented by numerous projects were presented by film interests of England. Most of the latter were based on "quota scheme,"

which provides for an agreed passage of "made in Britain" films to be shown along with foreign productions. Not all the Dominions, however, are willing to adopt the quota plan. Canada is among those holding out, and, it is predicted in conference circles, that the Dominion Premiers will recommend a general co-operative scheme for creased film production, leaving details, including the quota question, to the respective dominions.

## CHASED BY SHARK

Maine Fisherman Spends Night in Leaking Dory

PORTLAND, Me., Nov. 13-David Conrad tells a story of the fishing fleet. Losing his schooner, Benjamin Thompson, forty miles off Domariscove Island. Conrad rowed his leaking dory safe to shore in twenty-six hours. Part of the time he was rowing, steering by the sun and wind, the dory was followed by a huge shark which had been attracted to the boat by the fish Conrad threw overboard to lighten. The Benjamin Thompson spent Monday in sending up rockets to guide Conrad, but the lone fisherman hidden by a dense fog and already on his way toward land, failed to see the signals. Conrad spent Monday night bailing and rowing, attempting to plug the hole in his dory with his handkerchief and once in a while hurling fish at the fin which cut the water in circles about his boat. Today he rejoined the Benjamin Thompson and left for the fishing banks.

# Saint John Shows Need For Watching Small Pipe Leaks

How much aqua pura, or just plain water, do you think you use every day? Just 350 gallons for every man, woman and child in this city. People might smile broadly if they were told that they personally were responsible for the use of this amount of water but nevertheless it is a fact, for whether they use it or destroy it, it goes just the same.

of Saint John is 15,000,000 gallons per Apart from these reasons it means a day for every day of the year. In the winter time the quantity is still greater, owing to the fact that people leave their taps running and use just 3,000,000 gallons more every cold night. People might be very much surprised to hear this but the meters of the city go easy on the water, and if you can't go easy, go as easy as you can.

DETERMINING THE AMOUNT This city is supplied with water by three mains, two of them being 24-inch mains and the third a 12-inch main. This water is obtained from Loch Lomond, which passes through Lake Robinson, thence through Lake Latimer and into the different mains. The amount of water that pours through the two larger mains is 6,000,000 gallers and 2,000,000 through lons a day each and 3,000,000 through the smaller main.

For every hour of the day and night 250,000 gallons of water pour through these mains and for every second of the day 4,195 gallons pour through.
