### This Railroad Line Almost Runs Itself, Says Inventor

No Engineers or Crews Needed and Saving of 60 Per Cent., He  
Declares; Operation on Spiral By the Aid  
of Motors; Speed is Regulated.

London, Oct. 18.—It sounds like the  
realization of the dream of every rail-  
road magnate:

"This railway requires no engineers,  
brakemen, signal men or conductors,  
and can be operated at a saving in  
working expenses of from 50 to 60 per  
cent. over existing methods."

That is the claim of Captain R. Riall  
Sankey, past-president of the British  
Institute of Mechanical Engineers, re-  
garding the never-stop railway which  
he is developing. Nor are his claims  
only paper ones, for he has built at  
South End, a resort at the mouth of  
the Thames, a quarter-mile section of  
his railroad, just to show that it can  
be done.

The basic idea of the new invention  
which is being developed with especial  
regard to its utilization in place of  
subways and streetcars, is this:

The motive power is supplied by  
gasoline motors, which rotate an end-  
less screw between the two rails. Each  
coach is provided with wheels to en-  
gage upon this spiral, which has at in-  
tervals a much coarser pitch than at  
others. Quite automatically, as a train  
enters a station its speed is reduced  
from sixteen to two miles an hour. It  
is contended by the inventors that this  
slowing up for stations enables pas-  
sengers to alight and board the train  
without difficulty, and that thereby the  
need for train personnel is greatly di-  
minished.



### NEED 600,000 TONS OF ROCK FOR WORK

About 600,000 tons of big and small  
stones would be needed to extend the  
Negro Point breakwater to Partridge  
Island and so bridge the gap between  
the island and the shore. Alexander  
Gray, engineer of the Dominion De-  
partment of Public Works here, said  
yesterday on his arrival from Ottawa.  
Mr. Gray, who had been called to  
Ottawa in connection with the pro-  
posed work, said that the specifications  
for the extension of the breakwater  
were now being prepared, and would  
call for stone and rocks. About 200,  
000 tons of stone, weighing from five to  
ten tons each, would be necessary for  
the top of the extension, while about  
400,000 tons of smaller stone would be  
needed for the bottom. Mr. Gray said  
that the specifications would be ready  
in the course of a few weeks.


