New Financial Plan for Method St Churches | Family Nearly Wiped Out—Train Kills Two -Inso'vant Fined for Not Keeping Books-Suing for Damages.

TORONTO, Jan. 13.—For ten months of Ontario's fiscal year of 1909 the earnings of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway were \$1,361.—224. The expenditure totalled \$813,863, leaving a net revenue of \$547,355 from operation. The ore royalties for the year ending Oct. 31 totalled \$108,616, making a total net revenue of \$655,871. Rev. Dr. Carman is collecting information from the financial secretaries of the Methodist churches in Canada and Newfoundland regarding their system of finance for the purpose of preparing an entirely new scheme to present to the conference in August. The plan includes the appointment of a general treasurer with heads of other conference departments as members of the finance board. FURS LIKELY TO BE

Sealskin Coats Will Cost \$200 to \$300 More than Last Year

Other Strong Advances Gaused by Extraordinary Demand All Over

the continent of Europe, has ereated a remarkable advance in the price of raw skins, to the monetary alvantage of the trappers and collectors in all parts of the fur bearing world. The higher prices of sealskins is recorded in the ficial sales reports from London, just to hand. Sealskin does not to any extent affect the Canadian consumers, as most of those who can afford the luxury of a seal garment do not mind an advance of two or three hundred dollars in the price of a long fashionable model coat, but such much used pelts as muskrats, raccoons, skunks (called Alaska sable), mink, opposum, etc., quickly reach to the pocket of the average person, because in Canada furs are a necessity, aside from the element of fashion, which, of course, is exemplified also in increased number of skins required to make any article according to present vogues. Muskrats' skins which are entirely the porduct of the North American continent, have had an advance of 100 per cent, over prices ruling this time last year. The demand from Europe for this pelt, principally for dyeing as an intertation of sealskin heins tremendous
