Attempt May be Made to Have Attorney General Reopen the lequest to

UPTON, Que., Feb. 10.—The populace here is not entirely satisfied with the verdict rendered last night by a jury summoned by Coroner J. C. G. Gauthier, to investigate the cause of the death of Mrs. Cordelia Beaudoin wife of Joseph L'Heureux, who was found dead in her bed yesterday morning. While this jury has rendered a verdict of "natural death" the public gossip and certain facts which appear to have been ignored in coming to a verdict, will probably be submitted in an endeavor to induce the Attorney-General to order an examination of the viscera of the demand.

The latter was the third wife of Joseph L'Heureux, of Upton. The preceding wives died suddenly also.

Testifying under oath at the hospital, the husband of the deceased acknowledged that in the case of the death of his two former wives the doctors could not tell what were the causes of death. The verdict rendered on the body of the third wife was:

We believe that this death is due to natural causes, and we cannot find by the testimony adducted at the inquest that any person had any at the inquest that any person had any interest in the death of Mrs.L/Heureux. The doctors who made the autopsy have declared that the external bruises found on the body of the deceased were insufficient to cause death."
