### LEADER OF NEW SOCIALIST PARTY IN GERMAN PARLIAMENT DEMANDS THE RESTORATION OF BELGIUM

London, April 7 (4.45 p. m.)—A Reuter despatch says:

"There was an uproar in the Reichstag yesterday when Hugo Haase, leader of the newly formed Socialist minority group, declared that his party was strongly opposed to partition of Poland, and demanded the restoration of Belgium.

"The Baltic peoples, Lithuanians and Letts, did not desire union with Germany before the war," "said Herr Haase. "The injustice done to Belgium must be compensated for her by restoration as a state. In 1913 Herr Von Jagow (foreign minister) declared Germany would uphold their neutrality. Thus all the more surprising was the chancellor's announcement on August 4, 1914, that German troops probably had crossed the Belgian border."

Herr Von Jagow said in reply: "Herr Haase has dished up again old Belgian stories. When I made the declaration about Belgian neutrality I considered her a neutral country. It has been thoroughly proved that the responsibility for what has happened. Iles on Belgium's side."


