WOMEN'S WORK

The New Brunswick Women's Institutes celebrated their fifth anniversary last month, and since their inception have made rapid progress in humbers and usefulness. In the early days of this movement, the work was almost entirely confined to the exchange and discussion of recipes, but has since branched out along home economics, literary and civic betterment lines. It has meant to the people a social oneness never before realized. The benefits derived from Women's Institutes are many. The great principles of sanitation and ventilation in the home are taught; the proper combinations of toods; scientific house keeping and nursing. Women learn how to properly conduct a business meeting, keep accounts and value money. Latent talent has been developed. Then women of accomplishment in practical work, scientific and literary training have become knowly and the institute and their knowledge has been passed along to others through the medium of papers, addresses and demonstrations at the monthly meetings.

It would almost seem as if the Women's Institute came into existence just to help the British Empire in her fight for right and liberty during the terrible war which has been waging since August of 1914. In addition to its members making the supreme sacrifice of giving of their loved ones, almost ten thousand dollars has been raised for various patriotic and relief funds, and additional sums raised and collected to purchase and make up 13,015 Red Cross supplies and comforts for the soldiers, also yarn has been bought to knit 6,502 pairs of socks. With a motto "For Home and Country" the Women's Institutes realize more and more each day that "our country's welfare is our first concern, and who promotes that best, best proves his duty."
