CANADIAN TROOPS NOT PARTICIPATING IN LONDON PARADE

London, July 17, (C. A. P.)—Canadian headquarters have issued an explanation of the absence of Canadian troops from the great London procession on Saturday. They say it is

found impossible to accept the invitation extended by the War Office to the Canadian forces to take part in the peace celebration procession. Unfortunately, owing to the Canadian scheme of demobilisation, all organised units have already been registered. Canadian soldiers still remain in this country, but, while they individually receive a number of deplorable units, the circumstances of their departure prevent their being given ceremonial formation.
