JOHN SNOWBALL, who was born at North Allerton, England, Sept. 27th, 1794, and died in Sackville, N. B., Sept. 13th, 1871.

His parents were Episcopalians, and though failing to instruct him in the way of Salvation, gave him a good moral training. While young, however, he became concerned about his soul, and having been led to attend the preaching of the Methodists, he was more fully awakened to his sin and danger.
