"For more than thirty years the Methodist Conference has employed able and zealous Missionaries amongst the lower, and more neglected and superstitious part of the population, who, by frequently preaching in the Irish language, and addressing the crowds assembled at fairs and markets, have been favoured with no inconsiderable success. At present twenty-four Missionaries are thus engaged."

"SCHOOLS have also been established for the instruction of the children of the poor, under the direction of a general Superintendent. The number of Schools is twenty, containing, according to the last returns, one thousand four hundred chil-
