Brantford Alderman Faces Serious Charge.

Ald. J. Harvey Clement, Brantford, a member of one of the Exemption Tribunals which heard appeals for exemption from the workings of the Military Service Act, is charged with accepting a bribe of \$500 down, paid in March last year, and \$20 a month from that time to March of this year. The charge is laid by George Tomlin, who alleges that he paid this money to escape being called up. Ald. Clement promising that his case would be kept back. When he failed to secure a Government release for his money—he stating that Ald. Clement had told him the money went to the Government—he became suspicious and consulted J. W. Bowdler, K.C., and the charge followed. The case will come up before Magistrate Livingston on Friday. Ald. Clement is a foreman and Tomlin an employee of the Verity Plow Company, Brantford. Interviewed this afternoon, Ald. Clement denied the charges entirely, but refused to talk further or to give the name of his counsel. The case is exciting much interest in the city, the accused being prominent in Labor circles.

A Librarian For Every Normal School.

In addressing the students of the Normal School at Stratford yesterday, Hon. Dr. Cody, Minister of Education, made the following statement: "One aim of the Department is the appointment in every Normal School of a permanent librarian. There are in the Province now 3,000 school libraries, and when the consolidation of rural schools is accomplished the consolidated centre would likely be equipped with a library. Another new move will be the appointment to a domestic science teacher for each school, who will have charge of the general social life and leadership of the pupils in the Normal Schools."

Dr. Cody inspected the public schools and Collegiate Institute, Stratford, and addressed the Canadian Club and a public meeting afterwards. To the Canadian Club he spoke of the possibilities of technical education, and gave considerable encouragement to those planning and working for a technical school there.
