

PHILADELPHIA, June 29th 1795.

S I R,

I have seen in your paper of this date an abstract of the late Treaty between the United States and Great Britain, which tho' not perfectly correct is nearly so.

As this publication will probably excite a newspaper discussion, it is of importance that the People should possess a full and accurate knowledge of the subject to which their attention may be drawn, and which I think has already been improperly withheld from them. Left therefore the Treaty should be presumed more favourable, or represented to be less so than it really is, I send you herewith a genuine copy, which you may correct your statement by, or make such other use of as you please, for the purpose of giving to the citizens of America full information respecting this momentous business.
