Resigned upon being apptd. Lieut.-Governor, 8 Feb., 1887. (Salary, \$10,000.) Attended the Imperial Federation Conference held in London, Eng., April, 1887, as the representative of Can.—*Government House, Toronto; Rideau Club, Ottawa; St. James' Club, Montreal.*
