2. Bill to amend "The Inland Revenue Act of 1880" (Mr. Mousseau); Ordered; Presented, 372. Order for second reading discharged and Bill withdrawn; Leave given to present another Bill instead thereof; Bill presented, 435. Read a second time; Committed; Amended; Considered; Agreed to; Motion for third reading; Amendment moved by Mr. Bourassa, to recommit the Bill so as to provide that the cultivator of Tobacco may sell, free from taxation, the Tobacco raised on his farm; Negatived; Amendment moved by Mr. Vanasse, to recommit the Bill so as to provide that any person who may purchase Tobacco from the grower, may re-sell the same free of taxation; Negatived; Bill read a third time and passed, 496.
