

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was agreed to.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. Clemow, seconded by the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time presently.

The said Bill, as amended, was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with several amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read for the second reading of the Bill (O) intituled : "An Act further to amend the Fisheries Act ;"

The Honourable Mr. Ferguson (P.E.I.), moved seconded by the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell,

That the said Bill be now read a second time.

The Honourable Mr. Drummond, in amendment, moved, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Ogilvie,

That the said Bill be not now read a second time, but that it be read a second time this day six months.

After Debate,

The said motion in amendment was, by leave of the House, withdrawn.

On motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Desjardins, it was

Ordered, That further Debate on the said motion for the second reading of the Bill (O) intituled : "An Act further to amend the Fisheries Act," be postponed until tomorrow.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill (R) intituled : "An Act to amend an Act respecting the Representation of the North-west Territories in the Senate of Canada."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honourable Mr. Sullivan, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House, without any amendment.

On motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Ferguson (P.E.I.), it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

Then, on motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Ferguson (P.E.I.),

The Senate adjourned.
