2.-Answered by No. 1. 3.-The provisions of section 1 of the Act referred to have not been given effect to.

As you remember, section 11 is the one which gives the Governor-in-Council power to entrust the operation of the railways to the directors whomy section 1 empowers the Governor-in-Council

According to Mr. Calder himself, section 1 was not put into effect. That was in May of last year, and nothing has been done in that direction
