Speaking at Kingsville on June 15th, Mr. Bennett

is reported as follows in the London Free Press,-

"In regard to vegetables, the United States surplus was dumped on the Canadian market just before the Canadian crop was ready. He quoted figures to show the alarming increase in the importation of vegetables from the United States. He pointed out that a Liberal Minister of Customs, Hon. Jacques Bureau, in 1923, had recognized the danger and an Order-in-Council giving a measure of relief in the way of anti-dumping legislation, was passed but was never used. In 1926, the Conservatime government which held office briefly, enforced the order with beneficial results. In February, 1928, when Mr. King had manipulated for power in the House, the member for Weyburn had asked for a repeal of this Order-in-Council, and this was done."
