Debates of 1868 show that this broad legal principle was already honoured in the breach.

Mr. Dorion, of Quebec and Mr. Alexander Mackensie,
of Onterio, moved an amending resolution asking the
House to consider "the encouragement of the volunteer
organizations."

These obviously existed or they would not have referred to them.

The amendment went on to say -
"The volunteer system is of proved efficiency and
is specially adapted to the spirit and circumstances
of the people, and is capable of supplying a more
efficient and available force than that proposed
to be substituted."

Mr. Dorion's amendment was defeated, of course, but it was the voluntary system that was carried out in practice.
