greed, as Germany exploited Belgium, Serbia, or Rumania, but rather are regarded as opportunities of bringing succour to the needy and justice to the oppressed. The true Briton reveres his Empire for the might of its arms, the freedom of its institutions, and the justice of its dealings. But above and beyond this is the realization that the whole Empire is pervaded with a lofty sense of duty to humanity. This is the great truth which has won for the Empire the unshakeable loyalty of all its peoples, and which is carrying it ever forward in its great work of bringing justice and equity to the far corners of the earth.
