Captain John H. Russell, of the American schooner *Lucy Ann*, arrived here yesterday morning, in the brig *Richmond Lass*. The *Lucy Ann* was run down by the *Richmond Lass* on the evening of Wednesday, 6th June, during a heavy gale, about four leagues S. N. W. from Cape Ray, when all on board (amounting to seven individuals) with the exception of Capt. Russell, perished. Capt. R. fortunately got hold of the flue of the anchor of the *Richmond Lass*, and with the assistance of one of her crew, succeeded in getting on board. Capt. Abram was altogether unacquainted with the melancholy catastrophe until informed of it by Capt. Russell, after coming on board. He supposed that he was running through some old wreck. The *Lucy Ann* was on a fishing voyage to the Labrador coast; she belonged to Jacob Galashay, Esq., of Salem, Massachusetts, and was fully insured.

The brig *Equivalent*, Capt. Weatherly, arrived on Sunday last, had on board thirteen of the crew of the brig *George Barclay*, of Waterford, which vessel was lost on the Island of St. Paul, on the 27th May. She was from St. John, Newfoundland.—All saved.

## POSTSCRIPT.

The steamer *Charlevoix* arrived from Montreal to-day, about twelve o'clock. We have received the *Courier* of yesterday.

The *Charlevoix* brings a report that the steamer *Varennes* was burnt last night in the River Chambly.

A general order from the War Office at Washington directs a pretty large force to proceed immediately to the Frontiers.

In Congress, one or two resolutions connected with Canadian movements have been offered; but nothing has been done in regard to them.

The District Court of the United States is in session at Albany.

On Thursday, indictments were found and returned to the Court, by the Grand Jury, against Van Rensselaer, Mackenzie, Sutherland, and Bill Johnson.

In Sutherland's case the petit jurors will have little to do, as that worthy is happily already in good lands.

Nelson and Cote have been again arrested, to take their trial before the Court at Albany, for offences committed by them in the fitting out of their late expedition within New York State.

Gen. Wool is about to make public a complete expose of "the feats of Dr. Nelson," and his sympathizing brethren, which will redound very little to their credit.
