J. D. Freeman has given in, **Life on the Uplands** (William Briggs, Toronto, 127 pages, 75c. net), a quite fresh interpretation of the matchless Shepherd Psalm, turning upon the "Time-Notes" which he discovers in it at regular intervals, and which correspond to the successive periods of the shepherd's day and tasks. We have, therefore, A Morning Meal in the Meadows, A Midday Rest at the Well, and so on. The treatment rings true to the deepest meanings of the Psalm.

Two volumes of special interest to Sunday School workers come to us from The Pilgrim Press, Boston, Mass.: **Letters to Sunday School Teachers**, on the great truths of our Christian Faith, by President King, of Oberlin College (199 pages, \$1.00 net), and **Talks with the Training Class**, by Margaret Slattery (84 pages, 25c. paper, 60c. boards). The best praise of these timely and beautifully printed books is that they are worthy of their writers and of the subjects in hand.
