DUBLIN, ONT.—James Jordan, Clerk Hibbert Township, has been instructed to invite tenders for construction of Staffa drain. A committee has been appointed to get an estimate of the cost of a steel superstructure for the Cowie bridge.

SARNIA, ONT.—Ryder & Hand are this week taking tenders for remodelling the Hotel Bendome.—C. D. Stewart, Town Clerk, will receive tenders up to Thursday, 6th inst., for supply of concrete and glazed sewer pipe required by the town during the year.

NANAIMO, B.C.—A committee of the City Council has recommended that waterworks extensions costing \$9,840 be undertaken.—The quarries on Newcastle Island owned by the North-Western Construction Co., of Oakland, California, are again to be operated. New machinery will immediately be installed.

RAINY RIVER, ONT.—The rate-

payers will vote on a by-law this week to raise \$4,800 for the purchase of a steam fire engine, hose, reels and appliances. F.A. Gormley, Town Clerk.—A. E. Mark will receive tenders up to Monday, April 17th, for erection of an eight-roomed school.

KEEWATIN, ONT.—The Lake-of-the-Woods Milling Co. are about to build a new power house, 48 x 50 feet, of concrete and iron.—The Keewatin Flour Mills Co. have had plans prepared by the Allis-Chalmers Co. for a mill with a daily capacity of 5000 barrels, with elevator adjoining.

PORT ARTHUR, ONT.—A scheme is being considered to extend the electric railway by building a belt line round the town.—George T. Marks has had plans prepared for a stone and brick office block to be built on Lorne street and for a three storey brick and stone store building on Cumberland street.

ST. CATHARINES, ONT.—The proposed improvements to the Roman Catholic church here will include a steam heating plant and will cost upwards of

\$4,000. Next year a presbytery will probably be built.—W. B. Allan, architect, is preparing plans for three additional buildings to be erected by J. M. Ross, Sons & Co.

DUNDAS, ONT.—The Board of Education have engaged an architect to report as to the probable cost of a new High school.—The New Century Refrigerator Co. have completed arrangements to rebuild their dry kiln.—L. P. Spittal will probably build a number of houses of moderate size.

INDIAN HEAD, N.W.T.—At a meeting of citizens held on March 25th, permission was given the Town Council to prepare a by-law to raise \$140,000 for waterworks and sewerage systems and an electric light plant, in accordance with report submitted by John Galt, C. E., Toronto. The septic tank system of sewage disposal is to be adopted.

NIAGARA FALLS, ONT.—Robert Howe, inspector for the Canadian Fire Underwriters' Association, has recommended the purchase by the town of three steam fire engines and the construction of a 10,000,000 gallon fire engine.—The

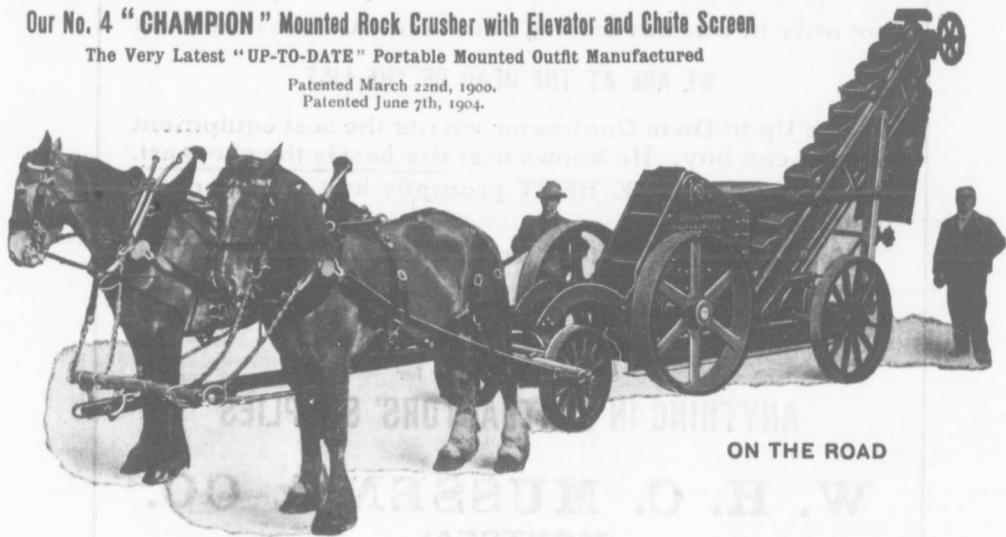

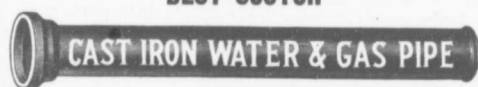
