- EASTVIEW, SASK.—The Methodist congregation are considering the erection of a new church.

BRACEBRIDGE, ONT.—The Council gives notice of its intention to construct cement sidewalks on Manitoba, Market, Ontario, Quebec, Dominion and McMurray streets.

ST. LEON SPRINGS, QUE.—It is said that MacKenzie & Mann intend extending a branch of the C. N. R. to this place and erecting an up-to-date summer hotel.

GUELPH, ONT.—A surveying party under Engineer John Davis, of Alton, are locating the proposed extension of the Guelph Radial Railway to Puslinch lake and Hespeler.

BEAMSVILLE, ONT.—On August 6th a by-law will be voted on to raise \$12,000 for new sidewalks, etc., also one to grant free water and free site and tax exemption to the canning factory.

ST. JOHN, N.B.—Lord Aylmer, Inspector General of Canadian Forces, considers that defences should be established at Partridge Island. He stated that this city needed a new drill hall also.

ST. CATHARINES, ONT.—The Niagara, St. Catharines & Toronto Railway Company are seeking permission to build a branch line on Jeneva street to connect their lines on Welland and St. Paul streets.

SASKATOON, SASK.—The C. P. R. have secured property on 33rd street, from the river to Prince Albert line for the erection of their new freight sheds and a site on 23rd street for the new station.

ROSTOCK, ONT.—D. J. Smith, reeve, has taken tenders for the construction of a concrete cement culvert on the Huron Road, also for a cement culvert and bridge on concession road 2 township of Elice.

KAMLOOPS, B.C.—The Council are taking steps to raise \$45,000 for a sewerage system.—W. H. Edmonds has taken tenders for the erection of an eight-roomed school building. W. T. White-way, architect, Vancouver.
