*Resolved*, That this House cannot agree to the Method proposed by the Committee of his Majesty's Council, and that in lieu thereof, a Bill be prepared for preventing the Exportation of Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, or Pease, until the First of May, 1770.

*Henry Denny Denson, Esq*; return'd a Member of this House for the Township of *Newport*, took the Oaths and his Seat.

Upon a Motion, leave was given to Mr. *Brenton* to bring in a Bill in further Amendment of the Act concerning Bail, and the said Bill having been presented accordingly, the same was read a First Time.
