[Paffed the 13th March, 1813.] MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

Y HEREAS in purfuance of an Address of your Commons House of Affembly. during its last Session, to His Honor Isaac Brock, Esquire, late President administering the Government of your Prøvince of Upper Canada, the fum of Eighty Eight Pounds, One Shilling and Nine Pence, have been illued and advanced by your Majefty, through your Prefident to the Clerks and other officers of the two Houfes of Pariament to enable them, to pay the contingent expenses of the laft Seflion of the Provincial Ligiflature: May it therefore pleafe your Majefly that it may be enacted, and Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice. and confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, conflituted and allembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act paffed in. the Parliament of Great Britain entituled, "an Act to repeal certain parts of an Act pailed in the fourteenth year of His Majefry's reign entituled " an Act for making-188 19, to more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North Ambeilfued to make erica, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province, and by god to much the authority of the fame, That out of the fund or funds subject to the disposition of fuance of an Ad the Parliament of this Province, now remaining in the hands of the Receiver General unappropriated there shall be issued and applied the Sum of Eighty Eight Pounds, One Shilling and Nine Pence, to make good the faid Sum which has been iffued and advanced in purfuance of the aforefaid addrefs.
