Divisional Court, before Boyd C., deredith J., Idington J. Chandler ivs. Gibson.-M. Wilson

Chandler vs. Gibson.—M. Wilson, K. C., for praintiffs, appealed from judgment of Falconbridge, C. J. (2. O. W. R. 843), dated 12th October, 1903. The plaintiffs appealed from report of local Master at Chatham, and the defendant Soane cross-appealed from the same report. The Master found that the value of the lands in question in this action, which had been enhanced by the lasting improvements made by the lasting improvements made by the defendant Scane under mistake of tiple since the date of the deed from Moses (Chandler to him, was \$1,-119.60; that the value of the lands at the date of the deed was \$1,000; that the present value of the lands was \$2,100, and after deducting cocupation, rent up to 22nd July, 1902, amounting to \$305, held defendant entitled to \$14.60, to be further reduced by amount of the occupation rent since 22nd July, 1902. Falconbridge, C. J., referred the report back to be varied by deducting \$19.60 from the sum allowed to defendant and by allowing defendant interest on the money expended on improvements. J. J. McCarthy, for defendant, contra. Judgment reserved.
