Application for a lease must be

made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the dis-

trict in which the rights applied for

are situated.
In surveyed territory the land must

be described by sections, or legal sub-

divisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for

shall be staked out by the applicant

Each application must be accom

panied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A

The person operating the mine shall turnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only, resonded by Chap. 27 of 4-5 George V. assented to 12th June, 1914.


